History of the Longreach Show Society Inc.

Longreach Show Society was established in 1895 and encompasses the Longreach Regional Council Areas – which includes the townships of Longreach, Ilfracombe, Isisford and Yaraka.

Due to the tradition of competition, our show attracts competitors from far and wide with exhibitors travelling from outside our region to be part of this

event. The Longreach Show Society provides a exhibition, mix of competition, festivities, culture. arts and entertainment and information to the Longreach Community and the broader Central West Region.

The Longreach Show has been many families' annual traditional outing for generations and as an institution in our community. The show has proven to be remarkably resilient.

(By TELEGRAM FROM OUR SPECIAL CORRESPONDENT)

This show was opened by the Governor on Tuesday, 11th April. Two thoseand people were present. The Society's new grounds and buildings are very extensive and convenient. The weather was unpleasant, and showers fell during the afternoon.

The show of sheep was not up to the usual standard, though there was an increase in the number of exhibits. There was only not southern exhibitor -- East Talgai. Ealtern Greek secured the shampion prize for grass-fed : Kansington Downs the champion for artificially fed. Minnie Downs carried off most of the prize. Ambo gained the prize for obampion grass-fed ewe, but in artificially-fed ewes the judge declined to award a champion prize, the exhibits not being deemed worthy.

The ram sales are very disappointing to owners, the prices mained being very low and the great majority of rame were tseeld.

In the blood-horse section Ayr Laddle gained champion honours, Martial Henry second. There was a magnificent exhibition of jumping. Rob Roy cleared 5 ft. 11 in , with several others sizes up.

The town is crowded with visitors. The weather is very threatening and rain is badly wanted.

PLEASE NOTE: All owners/riders must produce weigh bills for all horses coming into the Longreach Showgrounds.

The Property Identification Number for the Longreach Showgrounds Reserve is Lot 2 SP 142647.

- 1. Entry closing dates are as stated in each section. **FEES MUST ACCOMPANY ENTRIES.**
- 2. Exhibits will be received, subject to the approval of the Committee for exhibition only, without payment of entry fee. Application for space, horse stalls and classes must be made to the Secretary or the relevant Steward by the closing dates stated. The Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry as it deems fit.
- 3. All stock entered must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor, or of stations, the owners or managers of which are members of the Society, except for Open Classes and every exhibitor must furnish, when possible, the name of persons by whom his stock were actually bred and where.
- 4. All sheep for Championship Honors must have been shorn once, two-tooth rams or ewes shall be eligible for Champion and Grand Champion Honors.
- 5. No sheep shall compete in more than one class, except where specially provided.
- 6. At all exhibitions, the sheep exhibited shall have no letter brand which can indicate the owners, further than a private mark known only to the Secretary and Owner. If such labels or brands appear, they must be removed or covered up.
- 7. Nominations for all classes on Horse Section must be accompanied by name, age and description of each exhibit. Breeding certificates, Certification numbers and recording numbers must be produced for those entries in all Led Classes.
- 8. All exhibits of horses must be led in, and not driven loose or spare, into the yard. Horses to be led by adults, Ponies to be led by children under 18 years of age except where specifically stated.
- 9. All colts or stallions must be led with a chain, bar or some restrictive device.
- 10. Stallions or colts not to be led or ridden by persons under the age of 18 years.
- 11. No pony's height shall exceed 14 hands unless otherwise specified.
- 12. Hacks, Galloways and Ponies must be measured by our Official Measurer prior to the commencement of the show.
- 13. All horses and ponies exhibited at the Show shall be paraded at such times as the Committee may decide. Exhibitors shall be subject to a fine of \$1.00 in each case in which the order of the Stewards to parade is not obeyed, and shall be liable to forfeit any prize awarded to their exhibits.
- 14. Sheep and cattle are to be penned according to the times stated at the beginning of the respective Sections. Wool entries will be taken up to the time of judging. Times for delivery of Poultry exhibits and all Pavilion exhibits are detailed tat the beginning of the Poultry and Pavilion Sections. All other exhibits must be on the grounds by 9.00am on the morning of the exhibition. Exhibits shall not be removed without the permission of the Stewards.
- 15. Every care will be taken of exhibits, but the Committee will not be responsible for any losses or deaths.
- 16. Exhibitors of livestock will be allowed to admit such servants free of charge as are actually necessary to attend their exhibits, passes to be obtained from the Section Managers.
- 17. Grooms or others in charge of exhibits must obey the orders of the Stewards or they will be fined or ejected from the grounds.
- 18. No person shall act as Judge for classes in which he himself is an exhibitor.

2019 SHOW REGULATIONS

- 19. No person shall be admitted to the ground in the vicinity of stock during the time the Judges are awarding prizes, except the officials and the attendants.
- 20. Judges will withhold prizes and Championship Honours if they think it expedient.
- 21. In awarding the Championships, the Judges will be required to select the next animal in order of merit. To be called the 'Reserve' which will take the place of the Champion in the event of the latter being disqualified for any cause.
- 22. No badge or ribbon, except those won at the Show, shall be placed on any exhibit.
- 23. All competitors ride or drive at their own risk.
- 24. The Committee holds the right to add or delete any class or section from this schedule.
- 25. At the discretion of the Stewards, if it is found necessary to alter the program, the Ring Stewards have the power to do so.
- 26. Winners of Trophies are to hand same to the Secretary for engraving.
- 27. Prize money to be collected at the Secretary's Office on the last day of the Show.
- 28. ACCEPTANCE OF ENTRIES: The attention of intending exhibitors is drawn to the fact that entries are accepted subject to the Rules of the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies and to the Constitution and Rules of this Society in addition to any Special Regulations which appear within this Show Schedule.
- 29. All competitors under the age of 18 competing in horse or pony events must wear helmets and boots. Also in ridden classes all horses and ponies must be exhibited in bridles.
- 30. All Stallions and Colts unless being ridden or led by the handler are to be in their allocated Stallion stalls at all times. Exhibitors who do not abide by this rule may be asked to remove their horse from the ground.
- 31. All rules of HACK COUNCIL and EA apply at this show.
- 32. NO ELECTRIC FENCES ARE TO BE ERECTED ON THE SHOW GROUNDS OWING TO COUNCIL RULING.

THE DECISION OF THE JUDGE SHALL BE FINAL.

IMPORTANT NOTICES & RULES FOR ALL COMPETITORS

NO DRUG, hormone or tranquilizer shall be administered to any animal exhibit except under the direction of a vet who shall advise the stewards if in his opinion such drug, hormone or tranquilizer is likely to have any effect upon the animal which would be material to its chances of being awarded a prize and in such case the stewards may debar the animal from competing. A steward may at any time direct the vet to take a sample of blood, saliva or urine from an exhibit for testing.

Drug testing may be performed on any horse/pony or stallion

HORSE STALLS: Applications for horse stalls will close on Sunday 12th May 2019. A completed Application Form (Forms available on the Longreach Show webpage, and back of Show Schedule) accompanied by a **\$10 fee** per stall must be supplied for Stall Application acceptance, either by post or email to the Horse Secretary. See Horse Stall Application Forms for postal and email addresses and Bank details.

Stall allocations will be posted on the notice board at D BLOCK, on Thursday 16th May 2019 by 8.00am. Do not change your allocated horse stall or take one not allocated to you unless you have spoken to the Horse Stalls Steward - Jo Thomas Ph. 4658 1879 or 0427581879

ALL CAMPS AND STABLES are to be left clean and free of rubbish and manure. If left in an untidy manner, The Committee reserves the right to charge a cleaning fee. No electric fences are permitted in the camping area. There are several large yards and electric fences may only be used in these yards.

NO OVERNIGHT CAMPING AROUND ARENA FENCE as per designated area.

DOGS are to be kept on a lead at all times. When tied to campsite, lead is not to exceed one meter in length. A sign is to be placed to indicate the presence of a dog. The Longreach Show Society will not be held responsible for any injury or damage caused by or to any animal kept on the grounds.

TICKET SYSTEM ENTRY: Nomination Tickets will be available from the Recording Tent/Jump Shed from 7am Friday and from 7am Saturday. A refund may be claimed on unused, clean tickets.

Competitors must produce a completed nomination Ticket to the Ring Steward at the beginning of each Class.

All competitors and supporters are required to pay the normal Show Entrance fee of \$10 or be Members of the Society.

BIOSECURITY, RIDER INDEMNITY & MOVEMENT RECORD: Queensland Government Biosecurity requires that these details must be in hard copy for the Show Society to hold for a period of time. These forms, complete with Registered PIC numbers are to be left with the Ticket Steward when purchasing Nomination Tickets. The three forms can be downloaded from the Longreach Show website.

HORSE SECTION RULES

DRESSAGE ENTRIES: Dressage entries are to be handed to the secretary by COB Thursday 16th May 2019. **WORKING HORSE CHALLENGE ENTRIES:** All nominations for the working horse challenge to be forwarded to John Arnold.

MEASURING: All hacks, Galloway's and ponies must be measured by the Official Measurer. When measuring a hack, galloway or pony, an allowance of three eighths of an inch (3/8") is to be made for shoes.

BREED/ASSOCIATION REGISTRATION CERTIFICATES must be available for inspection upon entering applicable Classes.

ONE HORSE ONE RIDER applies across all classes regardless of ring or section.

RING 1: Open Hack Ring: Children over the age of 12 can compete in the open ring.

RING 2: Children's Ring: all horses are to be ridden by a child 17 years and under.

RING 3: Jump Ring:

PONIES: 14 hands and under

GALLOWAYS: Over 14 hands and not exceeding 15 hands

HACKS: Over 15 hands

MAIDEN: Has not won an event at an affiliated Agricultural Show.

NOVICE: Has won a Maiden Hack and will remain a NOVICE until winning an Open Championship at an affiliated Agricultural Show.

LOCAL/REGIONAL: Rider must be a resident of the Longreach Regional Shire for a minimum of 6 months. **DISTRICT:** Within Longreach, Barcaldine, Winton, Barcoo and Blackall Shire.

PLEASURE: Classes must be ridden in a plain snaffle, no spurs, whips or dropped nose bands.

STALLIONS: Stallions are not eligible to be entered in Hack or Rider Classes. Stallions in Led Classes are to be handled by a competent person 18 years and over.

DUAL USE OF JUDGING RINGS: Stewards/Judges reserve the right to direct overflow classes from one ring to another if a back log occurs in one ring.

CHAMPIONSHIP WINNERS: It would be appreciated if all competitors, in particular all prize winners, participate in the Grand Parade.

RULES FOR JUMPING EVENTS: All jumping events will be run under EA Rules. Any deviations will be made clear by the Judge at the commencement of the event. All jumping events to be "one horse, one rider" across all classes. Juniors riders are eligible to compete in all classes. Program may change at the Judge's discretion.

PRIZE MONEY: Prize Money, voucher or trophy is given for all Classes, except Championship Classes. No prize money for FIRST place where a trophy has been presented but there is money for placings Champions will receive a Sash and a Trophy. Prize Money may be awarded instead of a Trophy. **RIBBONS:** Ribbons will be awarded to 3rd place, except in Championship Classes, where sashes will be awarded to the Champion and Reserve Champions
