



1. CHECK OUT THE CLASSES ON OFFER

There is an event to suit everyone at the Show. Each section features classes that are open to a wide range of age groups and interests. Usually, you can enter in multiple classes and across different sections so don't be afraid to showcase your skills!

2. CHECK THE RULES & NOMINATION DATES

There are different nomination closing dates and times across all Sections and events, so please read through the Schedule details prior to the show. We would hate you to miss out! Also, please check the regulations for each Section to find the classes that best suit you. Need clarification? Contact the Head Steward as early as possible.

3. SUBMIT YOUR NOMINATIONS & ENTRIES

Now that you have decided what events to enter, it's time to submit your nomination form. Please try to be on time for all sections and remember to be polite to all stewards. They are volunteers after all! Late entries may not be accepted. Always remember to put your name, contact details and section on all submissions. Use our nomination form to make your entry process easier.

4. IT'S SHOW DAY

This is the moment you have been waiting for! Enjoy the spirit of the show & give it your best. Don't forget to check presentation times (even if you haven't won your event) so that you can be there to support other entrants & stewards who have worked hard to bring each Section to life. 2023 LONGREACH SHOW | 12-13 MAY

TO BE OBSERVED BY ALL EXHIBITORS

PLEASE NOTE: All owners/riders must produce weigh bills for all horses coming into the Longreach

Showgrounds.

The Property Identification Number for the Longreach Showgrounds Reserve is Lot 2 SP 142647.

- 1. Entry closing dates are as stated in each section. <u>FEES MUST ACCOMPANY ENTRIES.</u>
- 2. Exhibits will be received, subject to the approval of the Committee for exhibition only, without payment of entry fee. Application for space, horse stalls and classes must be made to the Secretary or the relevant Steward by the closing dates stated. The Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry as it deems fit.
- 3. All stock entered must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor, or of stations, the owners or managers of which are members of the Society, except for Open Classes and every exhibitor must furnish, when possible, the name of persons by whom his stock were actually bred and where.
- 4. No sheep shall compete in more than one class, except where specially provided.
- 5. At all exhibitions, the sheep exhibited shall have no letter brand which can indicate the owners further than a private mark known only to the Secretary and Owner. If such labels or brands appear, they must be removed or covered up.
- 6. Dates and times for delivery of exhibits across all sections is outlines in the Schedules for each section. Exhibits shall not be removed without the permission of the Stewards.
- 7. Every care will be taken of exhibits, but the Committee will not be responsible for any losses or deaths.
- 8. Grooms or others in charge of exhibits must obey the orders of the Stewards or they will be fined or ejected from the grounds.
- 9. No person shall act as Judge for classes in which he himself is an exhibitor.
- 10. No person shall be admitted to the ground in the vicinity of stock during the time the Judges are awarding prizes, except the officials and the attendants.
- 11. Judges will withhold prizes and Championship Honours if they think it expedient.
- 12. In awarding the Championships, the Judges will be required to select the next animal in order of merit. To be called the 'Reserve' which will take the place of the Champion in the event of the latter being disqualified for any cause.
- 13. No badge or ribbon, except those won at the Show, shall be placed on any exhibit.
- 14. All competitors compete, ride or drive at their own risk.
- 15. The Committee holds the right to add or delete any class or section from this schedule.
- 16. At the discretion of the Stewards, if it is found necessary to alter the program, the Ring Stewards have the power to do so.
- 17. Winners of Trophies are to hand same to the Secretary for engraving.
- 18. Prize money to be collected at the Secretary's Office prior to the last day of the Show.
- 19. ACCEPTANCE OF ENTRIES: The attention of intending exhibitors is drawn to the fact that entries are accepted subject to the Rules of the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies and to the Constitution and Rules of this Society in addition to any Special Regulations which appear within this Show Schedule.
- 20.All competitors under the age of 18 competing in horse or pony events must wear helmets and boots. Also in ridden classes all horses and ponies must be exhibited in bridles.
- 21. All Stallions and Colts unless being ridden or led by the handler are to be in their allocated Stallion stalls at all times. Exhibitors who do not abide by this rule may be asked to remove their horse from the ground.
- 22. All rules of HACK COUNCIL and EA apply at this show.
- 23. NO ELECTRIC FENCES ARE TO BE ERECTED ON THE SHOW GROUNDS OWING TO COUNCIL RULING.
- 24. Official Entry Forms Only: The General Entry Form is available online and all forms are available from the Secretary.

OPEN DOG HIGH JUMP RULES:

- 1. Competitors enter their animal(s) at their own risk. By entering dog/dogs, competitors understand that they have entered in the competition/s at his/her own risk and that in doing so the Longreach Show Society accepts no responsibility for any risk or injury caused during the event.
- 2. Judge/Committee reserves the right to exclude any dog/bitch from this event without the owner/handler necessarily being informed of the reason.
- 3. All dogs MUST be kept on lead at all times, until it is their turn to compete in this event
- 4. Open High Jump Dogs may start at a nominated height but once the Board reaches 1.8m, must start and continue as the Board is raised.
- 5. Each dog/bitch may have 3 attempts at the jump at the current height and shall be disqualified if unsuccessful on the 3rd attempt.

THE DECISION OF THE JUDGE SHALL BE FINAL.

Important Notices & Rules for All Competitors

NO DRUG, hormone or tranquilizer shall be administered to any animal exhibit except under the direction of a vet who shall advise the stewards if in his opinion such drug, hormone or tranquilizer is likely to have any effect upon the animal which would be material to its chances of being awarded a prize and in such case the stewards may debar the animal from competing. A steward may at any time direct the vet to take a sample of blood, saliva or urine from an exhibit for testing.

Drug testing may be performed on any horse/pony or stallion

HORSE STALLS: Applications for horse stalls will close on Sunday 6th May 2023. A completed Application Form (Forms available on the Longreach Show webpage, and back of Show Schedule) accompanied by a **\$10** fee per stall must be supplied for Stall Application acceptance, either by post or email to the Horse Secretary. See Horse Stall Application Forms for postal and email addresses and Bank details.

Stall allocations will be posted on the notice board at D BLOCK, on Thursday 11th May 2023 by 8.00am. Do not change your allocated horse stall or take one not allocated to you unless you have spoken to the Horse Stalls Steward - Jo Thomas Ph. 4658 1879 or 0427581879

ALL CAMPS AND STABLES are to be left clean and free of rubbish and manure. If left in an untidy manner, The Committee reserves the right to charge a cleaning fee. No electric fences are permitted in the camping area. There are several large yards and electric fences may only be used in these yards.

NO OVERNIGHT CAMPING AROUND ARENA FENCE as per designated area.

DOGS are to be kept on a lead at all times. When tied to campsite, lead is not to exceed one meter in length. A sign is to be placed to indicate the presence of a dog. The Longreach Show Society will not be held responsible for any injury or damage caused by or to any animal kept on the grounds.

TICKET SYSTEM ENTRY: Nomination Tickets will be available from the Recording Tent/Jump Shed from 7am Friday. A refund may be claimed on unused, clean tickets.

Competitors must produce a completed nomination Ticket to the Ring Steward at the beginning of each Class.

All competitors and supporters are required to pay the normal Show Entrance fee of \$10 or be Members of the Society.

BIOSECURITY, RIDER INDEMNITY & MOVEMENT RECORD: Queensland Government Biosecurity requires that these details must be in hard copy for the Show Society to hold for a period of time. These forms, complete with Registered PIC numbers are to be left with the Ticket Steward when purchasing Nomination Tickets. The three forms can be downloaded from the Longreach Show website.

DRESSAGE ENTRIES: Dressage entries are to be in the hands of the horse secretary by COB Wednesday 11th May 2022.

WORKING HORSE CHALLENGE ENTRIES: All nominations for the working horse challenge to be forwarded to Central Western Equestrian Group Secretary cweginc@gmail.com

MEASURING: All hacks, Galloway's and ponies must be measured by the Official Measurer. When measuring a hack, galloway or pony, an allowance of three eighths of an inch (3/8") is to be made for shoes.

BREED/ASSOCIATION REGISTRATION CERTIFICATES must be available for inspection upon entering applicable Classes.

ONE HORSE ONE RIDER applies across all classes regardless of ring or section.

RING 1: Open Hack Ring: Children over the age of 12 can compete in the open ring.

RING 2: Children's Ring: all horses are to be ridden by a child 17 years and under.

RING 3: Jump Ring:

PONIES: 14 hands and under

GALLOWAYS: Over 14 hands and not exceeding 15 hands

HACKS: Over 15 hands

MAIDEN: Has not won an event at an affiliated Agricultural Show.

NOVICE: Has won a Maiden Hack and will remain a NOVICE until winning an Open Championship at an affiliated Agricultural Show.

LOCAL/REGIONAL: Rider must be a resident of the Longreach Regional Shire for a minimum of 6 months.

DISTRICT: Within Longreach, Barcaldine, Winton, Barcoo and Blackall Shire.

PLEASURE: Classes must be ridden in a plain snaffle, no spurs, whips or dropped nose bands.

STALLIONS: Stallions are not eligible to be entered in Hack or Rider Classes. Stallions in Led Classes are to be handled by a competent person 18 years and over.

DUAL USE OF JUDGING RINGS: Stewards/Judges reserve the right to direct overflow classes from one ring to another if a back log occurs in one ring.

CHAMPIONSHIP WINNERS: It would be appreciated if all competitors, in particular all prize winners, participate in the Grand Parade.

RULES FOR JUMPING EVENTS: The jump judge will instruct all riders on the rules before the jumping events start. Each horse is eligible to have a maximum of 3 competition starts per day excluding feature events. All jumping events to be "one horse, one rider" across all classes, a rider may ride more than one horse. Junior riders can ride in open classes providing they have not exceeded the 3 start rule Junior riders are eligible to compete in all classes. Program may change at the Judge's discretion.

PRIZE MONEY: Prize Money, voucher or trophy is given for all Classes, except Championship Classes.

No prize money for FIRST place where a trophy has been presented but there is money for placings

Champions will receive a Sash and a Trophy. Prize Money may be awarded instead of a Trophy.

RIBBONS: Ribbons will be awarded to 3rd place, except in Championship Classes, where sashes will be awarded to the Champion and Reserve Champions.

- A National Sheep Health Statement (SHS). A completed SHS is required at entry or at the latest, upon delivery. Sheep Health Statement Forms will be provided at delivery and can be completed on arrival, or are available for download online.

- 1. Except where stated otherwise, all sheep entered in competitive classes must have been bred and depastured in the state of Queensland by the exhibitor. They must be entirely paddock run and display the exhibitor's registered ear mark & NLIS tag.
- 2. The judge and/or stewards may disqualify any sheep, which in their opinion, has been fed and/or trimmed, especially for exhibition, except wigging and/or crutching.
- 3. Basis of judging: Pens of ewes to be judged on a commercial basis as wool cutters and sound commercial breeding types; uniformity within the pen will be taken into account. Udders must be sound, i.e two normal teats and be capable of efficiently suckling a lamb.
- 4. Local pen exhibits must be produced in the Longreach area with the exhibitor's property falling in the Longreach or Ilfracombe postcodes.
- 5. Teeth: In the event of the sheep cutting teeth on Show Day, the judge or steward has the right to move these sheep to an older section for judging.
- 6. Entries: The steward has the right to accept or reject any entry in any competitive class without assigning any reason thereto.
- 7. The decision of the judge will be final.
- 8. Sales: No sheep, either ewes or rams, are to be sold during this show except those which have be donated to the Longreach Show Society and which may be sold by auction or private treaty for the sole benefit of the Society.
- 9. Entrance fees will be charged alike to member and non-members.
- 10. Aggregate Points: 1st place 3pts, 2nd place 2pts, 3rd place 1pt, Grand Champion 2pts, Reserve Grand Champion 1pt, Champion 2pts, Reserve Champion 1pt.
- 11. Proof of shearing date may be required.


